

**CITY OF CLAYTON, OHIO DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY**

The Mayor and the City Manager of the City of Clayton, Ohio have declared a State of Emergency in the City of Clayton, Ohio as a result of damages from an F3 tornado which impacted the City on Monday evening, May 27, 2019.


The current status of the City of Clayton as of Tuesday, May 28, 2019 is as follows:

- Several areas in the City are currently without power and power outages are expected to continue and may continue for an extended number of days before power is completely restored to all areas;
- Numerous Clayton households are without water and water tankers are strategically locate around the local area for fire extinguishment purposes.
- Several key intersections lack power for traffic control purposes and must be manned to maintain the orderly flow of traffic and minimize crashes.
- City Public Works crews continue to work to clean up storm debris and to make the City as safe as possible; Duties include: cleaning and removal of trees, branches and debris from City streets and rights of way and cleaning of streets for access.
