### ORDINANCES (SINGLE READING AND IMMEDIATE ENACTMENT AS AN EMERGENCY)

#### ORDINANCE NO. O – 12 – 20 – 22

#### AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON DESIGNATED PORTIONS OF HILLTOP DRIVE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

**WHEREAS**, R.C. 4511.07 permits municipalities to adopt local traffic regulations including prohibitions on parking; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Clayton deems the parking or placement of vehicles on certain designated areas of public streets to be contrary to the intended use and function of said public streets and contrary to the public safety; and

**WHEREAS**, Council desires to empower the City through its Police Department to enforce restrictions against such parking.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF CITY OF CLAYTON, STATE OF OHIO:**

1. That upon the effective date of this Ordinance:

"No person shall stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon the paved or main traveled portion of Hilltop Drive for a distance of 265 feet East of the intersection of Shadywood Drive and Hilltop Drive within the municipal limits of the City of Clayton. In the event a vehicle is stopped, parked or left standing upon the unpaved right of way of Hilltop Drive within this area, a clear and unobstructed portion of the roadway opposite such standing vehicle shall be left for the free passage of other vehicles, and a clear view of such stopped vehicle shall be available from a distance of two hundred feet in each direction upon such roadway."

"Whoever violates any provision of this Ordinance is guilty of a minor misdemeanor in accordance with Ohio Rev. Code 4511.99."

2. That the City Manager is directed to cause the Police Department and Public Service Department to promptly post appropriate "No Parking" signs within this designated area.

3. That this Ordinance shall be effective as an exception to any ordinance, resolution or other legislation of the City of Clayton, Ohio, inconsistent with this Ordinance or which imposes additional requirements for effectiveness or validity.

4. That in accordance with Charter Section 4.031(B) the requirement that this ordinance be read on two (2) different days is dispensed with by affirmative vote of at least five (5) of the members of Council.

5. That, unless prompt implementation of restrictions on parking on Hilltop Drive within the City of Clayton can be achieved, public health and safety and welfare will be detrimentally affected. Accordingly, in accordance with Charter Section 4.033(A) this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City and shall therefore be in full force and effect from and immediately upon affirmative vote of at least five (5) of the members of Council.

### **RESOLUTION NO. R – 12 – 20 – 65**

#### **A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR TO REQUEST THE COUNTY AUDITOR TO MAKE ADVANCE PAYMENTS INTO THE CLAYTON ACCOUNT**

**WHEREAS**, O.R.C. Section 321.34 provides for advance payments by the county auditor to municipal corporations whose funds are derived from taxes or other sources payable by law to the county treasury, any money that may be in the county treasury to the account of the municipality, respectively and lawfully applicable to the purpose of the current fiscal year in which the request is made; and

**WHEREAS**, consistent with O.R.C. Section 321.34(A)(2)(b) it is the intent of the Clayton City Council to use the money for the purposes of the fiscal year in which the request is made.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLAYTON, STATE OF OHIO:**

1. That on and after the first business day in January 2021, the Finance Director is hereby authorized to request the Montgomery County Auditor to make an advance payment of any moneys that may be in the Montgomery County Treasury to the account of Clayton, respectively and lawfully applicable to the purpose of the current fiscal year in which the request is made.

2. That, consistent with O.R.C. Section 321.34(A)(2)(b) it is the intent of the Clayton City Council to use the money for the purposes of the fiscal year in which the request is made.

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**RESOLUTION NO. R – 12 – 20 – 66**

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A RENEWAL AGREEMENT WITH ANTHEM BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD FOR THE PROVISION OF GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS FROM JANUARY 1, 2021 THROUGH AUGUST 31, 2021**

**WHEREAS**, via enactment of Resolution No. R- 11-20-59 on November 19, 2020, Council authorized the City to become a member of the Ohio Benefits Cooperative (“OBC”) thereby permitting the City to purchase medical, dental, and life insurance through said Cooperative; and

**WHEREAS**, working with OBC, health insurance quotes were received and reviewed; and

**WHEREAS**, renewal of the current Anthem policy via OBC permits continuation of the contract plan at the best and lowest price reasonably possible maintaining a consistent benefit level; and

**WHEREAS**, City Staff has reviewed the information provided and recommends renewal with Anthem.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLAYTON, STATE OF OHIO:**

1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to accept the proposal of and enter into a renewal agreement with Anthem Blue Cross Blue Shield for the provision of group health insurance benefits from January 1, 2021 through August 31, 2021.
2. That this Resolution shall be effective as an exception to any ordinance, resolution or other legislation of the City of Clayton, Ohio, inconsistent with this Resolution or which imposes additional requirements for effectiveness or validity.
